Publication Ethics and Malpractice Statement

The Asociación Argentina de Médicos Residentes de Cirugía General (Argentine Association of General Surgery Residents) has published the *Revista Argentina de Residentes de Cirugía (Argentine Journal of General Surgery Residents)*, uninterruptedly every six months since 1996, with the collaboration of all Surgery Residents and Attending Physicians in the country.

The growth of the magazine has enabled it to open both nationally and internationally online, in two languages, generating a history of commitment with the scientific community, based on quality and scientific method.

As a peer-reviewed journal, it is important that all the parties involved agree with these publication ethics and malpractice statements, which are based upon the Committee on Publication Ethics' standard guidelines (COPE) (<http://www.publicationethics.org>).

The Editorial Board shall supervise publications for safeguarding ethics.

1. Authors' responsibilities

- a. All persons designated as authors should qualify for authorship.
- b. Any potential conflict of interests must be declared.
- c. To guarantee that all information included in the article is accurate and authentic.
- d. To issue retractions or cooperate with corrections of mistakes where necessary.
- e. To count on the permission to reproduce already published material from other sources.
- f. Authors are exclusively responsible for the content of the papers.

2. Reviewers' responsibilities

- a. To contribute with objectively reviewing the manuscript.
- b. To maintain the confidentiality of any piece of information supplied.
- c. To avoid retaining or copying the manuscript.
- d. Reviewers must not have conflict of interests as regards the research.

3. Editorial responsibilities

- a. No material which content has been previously published, either partially or totally, shall be received.



- b. Editors should have no conflict of interests as regards the articles. Moreover, they should request authors to disclose any commercial association that may cause a conflict of interests.
- c. To make sure there is no discrimination of gender, sexual orientation, religious or political beliefs, ethnic or geographical origin of the authors.
- d. To promote the publication of corrections or retractions.
- e. To assert confidentiality of the submitted material and protect the identities of reviewers.
- f. Editors should make sure that there is no plagiarism and that no fraudulent information is being published.
- g. Editors are completely responsible for and have the authority to reject/accept an article.

4. Unethical behavior

- a. Unethical behavior is understood as:
 - I. Previous publication without proper permission or justification.
 - II. Multiple or redundant publication.
 - III. Plagiarism.
 - IV. False data.
- b. If misconduct or unethical behavior is suspected, Editors have the responsibility of rejecting the manuscript, with adequate preservation of confidentiality and the opportunity to respond to any allegations.
